What measurable outcomes has this ministry produced in the past year?

7. Resources & Budget
What financial, human, or material resources does this ministry use?
Is the budget sufficient and responsibly managed?
 Are resources being duplicated or underutilized?
8. Improvement Areas
What are this ministry's top three challenges?
What could be improved or eliminated?
What support is needed from church leadership?

Should this ministry be sustained, restructured, or sunsetted? What changes will help it thrive in the next 6–12 months? Who should be involved in implementing these changes?
