This worksheet helps worship leaders and pastors design a service flow that is rooted in Scripture, intentional in structure, and conducive to spiritual transformation. For digital worship service planning, use Planning Center

Instructions: Use the guiding questions in each section to plan a worship service. Reflect on how each element contributes to a cohesive flow and evangelistic purpose.

1. Theme & Scripture FoundationWhat is the main theme or spiritual emphasis of the service?
• What scripture(s) support this theme?
What is the desired spiritual outcome for attendees?
2. Welcome & Opening
Who will welcome attendees and how will they set the spiritual tone?
• Will a scripture, prayer, or call to worship be used at the beginning?

3. Praise & Worship
What songs will reinforce the service theme? And the service theme?
• Is there a balance of celebration, reflection, and intimacy in the music?
Are the songs singable and familiar to your audience?
4. Prayer & Scripture Reading
Who will lead in prayer, and what will they pray for?
• Will you incorporate corporate or intercessory prayer?
• What Scripture passage(s) will be read publicly?

5. Testimony or Ministry Highlight (optional)Is there a story or testimony that connects to the theme?
 How does this moment help people see God at work?

6. Offering & Giving Moment
What message about stewardship connects to the service theme?
How will you encourage people to give with joy and purpose?
7. Sermon or Devotional Message
• What is the core message of the sermon?
What response or decision are you inviting people to make?
 How long is the message, and how does it fit into the overall flow?
8. Appeal or Call to Action
• Will there be an altar call, reflection time, or response card?
What clear action should people take in response to the Word?

9. Closing & Benediction
How will the service end with spiritual encouragement?
• Will a final song, scripture, or blessing be used?
10. Post-Service Engagement
• What follow-up opportunities will be shared (e.g., Bible study, baptism class)?
How can guests connect with leaders or join a ministry?

Sample Worship Service Flow

- 1. Pre-Service Music: Instrumental praise to set the atmosphere
- 2. Welcome & Scripture Reading: Isaiah 55:6-7 Invitation to seek the Lord
- 3. Praise & Worship: Uplifting songs focused on grace and salvation
- 4. Prayer: Intercession for those seeking Christ
- 5. Testimony: A short story of personal transformation
- 6. Offering: Encouragement to sow into Kingdom work
- 7. Sermon:
